Dislocated Worker

The term "dislocated worker" means an individual who—

- (A) (i) has been terminated or laid off, or who has received a notice of termination or layoff, from employment, including separation notice from active military services (under other than dishonorable conditions);
- (ii) (I) is eligible for or has exhausted entitlement to unemployment compensation; or
- services for an employer that were not covered under a State unemployment compensation law; and 121(e), attachment to the workforce, but is not eligible for unemployment compensation due to insufficient earnings or having performed (II) has been employed for a duration sufficient to demonstrate, to the appropriate entity at a one-stop center referred to in section
- (iii) is unlikely to return to a previous industry or occupation;
- (B) (i) has been terminated or laid off, or has received a notice of termination or layoff, from employment as a result of any permanent closure of, or any substantial layoff at, a plant, facility, military installation or enterprise;
- (ii) is employed at a facility at which the empioyer has made a general announcement that such facility will close within 180 days; or

Where allowable, self-attestation should be used only by exception. In all cases, attempts to gather required documents and a signed statement of self-attestation must be documented. Documentation, other than self-attestation, must be provided for at least one barrier relevant to eligibility.
